OVERVIEW

Located in the Arctic Circle, West Greenland is a land of rugged beauty and breathtaking wilderness. It is home to the world's largest fjord system, with dramatic coastlines dominated by towering icebergs, active glaciers, and pristine waters. This remote region offers a unique blend of Inuit villages, untracked tundra, and an abundance of Arctic wildlife. From polar bears and reindeer to seals and whales, West Greenland is a haven for nature enthusiasts seeking an unforgettable adventure in one of the planet's wildest places.

Join this expedition for a week of sailing, kayaking, and hiking through the ice and fjords of West Greenland. Using the 16-passenger schooner, *Elsi*, we journey north from Ilulissat through Disko Bay to Disko Island and Uummannaq Fjord. Each day offers opportunities to paddle among icebergs, trek through picturesque valleys, visit remote communities, and search for whales under the midnight sun.

This trip is designed for paddlers, hikers, and those seeking an in-depth experience of the west coast of Greenland with a small group of like-minded travelers.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 - OVERNIGHT IN ILULISSAT

Overnight in Ilulissat. This evening you'll meet your expedition leaders for the trip briefing.

DAY 2 - EMBARK ELSI & SET SAIL FOR DISKO ISLAND

The morning is yours to explore and in the afternoon we transfer direct to our schooner Elsi. On boarding, you'll meet the crew, settle into your cabin and prepare for the upcoming journey. We may have time before departure to sort and fit the kayaking equipment or even enjoy a short stroll or paddle around Ilulissat.

After dinner on board, we will set sail for Disko Island, located in Baffin Bay and the largest island along Greenland's main coast. While out on deck, we'll keep an eye out for whales, frequent summer visitors to Disko Bay include humpback, minke and fin. We experience the endless light of the polar north summer, where the sun remains visible 24 hours a day, providing ample opportunities for outdoor activities and sightseeing, even in the late hours of the night.

DAY 3 - DISKO ISLAND

Disko Island, Qeqertarsuaq in Greenlandic, is volcanic in origin and the steep basalt mountains and hot springs differentiate the island from anywhere else in Greenland. We begin our day with a paddle or hiking excursion on the southern coast of Disko Island, exploring stunning black beaches and hidden coves. We'll hike to the breathtaking waterfalls of Blaesedalen (Valley of the Winds) and discover the diverse and abundant flora of the island. As we trek or paddle along the coast, we'll enjoy spectacular views of gigantic icebergs floating both up close and beyond. After a hearty lunch, we will set sail for the fjords of western Disko Island.

DAY 4 - DISKO ISLAND - WESTERN FJORD

Today we explore the western expanse of Disko Island, hiking along open valleys and

paddling the remote coastline. Our sturdy vessel, Elsi, will accompany us as we journey through the fjords. Disko Island is world renowned as a significant breeding ground for two species of birds, the white-fronted goose and the king eider and for three Ramsar sites, wetlands designated to be of international importance. This afternoon we will set sail for Uummannaq, a journey that will see us sailing through the polar night.

DAY 5 - UUMMANNAQ

Located 600 kilometers north of the Arctic Circle is Uummannaq Island and town, both sharing the same name. The town is located at the foot of a heart shaped mountain and is perfect to explore. Part of the town's charm is the enormous red post box where letters to Santa are received from all over the world and replied to by volunteers in Santa's 'office', located between the church and museum. The panoramic view of the fjord from the shore is truly breathtaking, offering an incredible backdrop for our hikes and paddles. This afternoon we will sail to the east, delving deeper into the Islands of Uummannaq Fjord.

DAY 6 - UUMMANNAQ FJORD & APPAT ISLAND

To the east of Uummannaq lies a selection of Islands set against the Greenland icecap. Depending on the wind and ice, we intend to explore the Islands with the chance to hike, paddle and sail in this most spectacular and remote part of West Greenland. We will endeavor to visit Appat Island, one of the larger islands in the Uummannaq Fjord system. The island is very mountainous, with precipitous walls falling from the glaciated summit plateau in all directions, a stunning backdrop for our kayak outings.

DAY 7 - TRANSIT DAY

Most of today will be spent sailing southward from Uummannaq Fjord to Arve-prinsens Ejland. Enjoy the open ocean, expansive landscapes, spectacular icebergs and keep an eye out for whales from the deck of the ship during our transit.

DAY 8 - ARVE-PRINSENS EJLAND

Today we awake in the fjords near Arve-prinsens Ejland (named Alluttoq in Greenlandish), in the north of Disko Bay. This area is ideal for hiking, kayaking among the ice and searching for Greenland's elusive wildlife. We will paddle and cruise deep into the fjords, watching for ice broken away from the Greenland Icecap. For those

inclined to stroll, we may have the chance to hike a short section of tundra to a glacial lake.

After lunch, we head further south to Oqaatsut, also known as Rodebay and named after Dutch whalers. Here, we will explore the coastline by tender or kayak, navigating the waters and observing remnants of whales on the seabed. This area offers a fascinating insight into the region's whaling history. We will enjoy our final meal together tonight and re-live the incredible experiences and natural wonders encountered during our journey. Later this evening we set sail for Ilulissat.

DAY 9 - ILULISSAT

The expedition concludes in Ilulissat today. You can choose to continue exploring more of Greenland by land or catch a flight to your next destination.

THE LIVEABOARD



ELSI

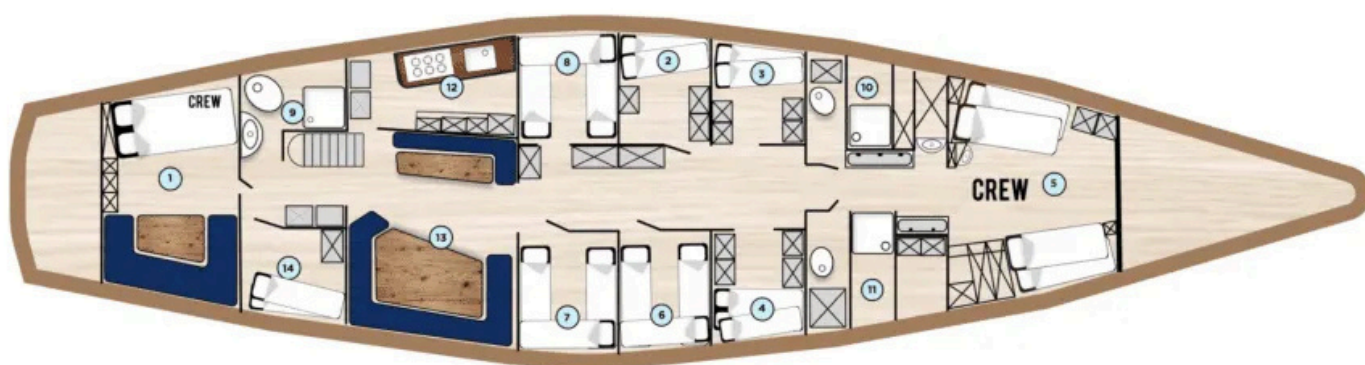
Built in 1986 at the German Blumenthaler shipyard, the schooner Elsi began her working life as a training expedition vessel. After extensive renovations in 2013, Elsi embarked on medical humanitarian missions to remote corners of the world.

In 2022, she began operating in the Polar regions. She is well fitted for polar travel with heating, satellite communication and comfortable living quarters. With her rich legacy and modern comforts, Elsi offers a cozy and safe haven making her the perfect vessel for our Greenland sailing and kayaking adventure.

There are eight cabins on board for clients and crew. Cabins are a mixture of double and triple berths. There are three heads and showers and a dining area. Elsi's large deck ensures passengers can comfortably move around and enjoy the fantastic surroundings. The enclosed and heated pilot house provides a refuge from the cold, with huge windows ensuring those that like to warm up won't miss a thing.

There are two cabin options for guests. The boat has 3 twin share cabins with upper and lower bunks and 3 triple cabins. There are 3 bathrooms with toilet, sink and shower. The dining area is massive and comfortable, our onboard chef will keep us well fed with hearty and tasty meals.

The upper deck is huge providing plenty of space to storage equipment and to relax while enjoying the incredible scenery. If you'd prefer to stay warm but don't want to miss anything there is also a large pilothouse which stays toasty warm.

ACTIVITIES

WALKS, HIKES AND CRUISING

Cruise the fjords on the yacht's tender and come ashore for either gentle strolls or more energetic hikes led by our expert guides. These activities are all included in your trip cost.

KAYAKING (OPTIONAL)

We intend to use the ship as a comfortable floating base camp, paddling at every opportunity and returning for the comfort of meals and our cosy cabins. A tender will be available for extended shore excursions for those who do not wish to paddle on any given day.

We hope to paddle one to two times a day, with most paddles ranging from two and a half to four hours. We aim to have at least one extended paddle where we will be away from the ship for most of the day and generally meet the ship at a different location. Landing ashore by kayak, we can stretch our legs and enjoy spectacular walks with the chance of spotting rare Arctic flora and fauna. The flexibility of kayaking with a small private group ensures our own unique experiences, the quiet dip of your paddle perfectly suited to our awe-inspiring surroundings. Your kayak surcharge covers use of a drysuit, all your paddling and kayak equipment and the services of a professional sea kayak guide.

We'd be happy to talk to you about your level of experience and may be able to advise you on how to obtain the necessary skills before your trip.

The **Elsi** is the perfect vessel for this Arctic journey. Originally built in 1986 as a training expedition ship, she was extensively renovated in 2013 for humanitarian missions before beginning her Polar voyages in 2022. Designed for high-latitude travel, she is equipped with heating, satellite communication, and spacious living quarters. The large deck offers panoramic views of Greenland's dramatic landscapes,

while the heated pilot house provides a cozy refuge from the elements. With a blend of history, modern amenities, and rugged capability, *Elsi* serves as both a basecamp and a gateway to the wild Arctic.



THINGS TO KNOW

HOW TO GET THERE

The starting place is Reykjavik in Iceland. There are two ways of travelling to Iceland; by flight or ferry. Around 20 airlines offer regular flights from destinations in Europe and North America to Reykjavik airport. For those who have more time, Smyril Line operates a weekly car-ferry service from Denmark to Iceland, enabling a self-drive holiday.

IS THIS TRIP FOR YOU

While we have a range of activities available from easy shore landings and zodiac cruises to active hikes and paddles, it is most important that you have an adventurous disposition, are in good health and are relatively fit and active to participate in this trip. Our shore landings and zodiac cruises are suitable for all those with the ability to enter the tender from the yacht with assistance from the expedition team.

Our active hikes will often be over several miles/kilometers of varied terrain from gentle tundra to steep slopes on a mix of uneven, rocky ground and may involve some scrambling.

Our paddling program is focussed on those looking for active outings. If you have any questions or concerns please contact our team to discuss.
